8.1.27 Floor Scrubbers

The following safe work practices will reduce injury risks involving Floor Scrubbers:

- Take all necessary precautions for the protection of the operator and other persons.
- Wear non-slip footwear when scrubbing.
- Learn how to operate through training.
- Exercise attention at all times during use.
- Be aware of power cord location during use, keeping it behind the user and machine as much as possible.
- Ensure that routine and preventative maintenance is carried out periodically.
- Unplug the machine when cleaning, servicing or maintaining the machine.
- Keep the machine clean.
- Replace any worn or damaged parts immediately.
- Regularly examine the power cord for damage, such as cracking or aging. If damaged, replace with approved replacement cord only.
- Ensure that the work area is clear of obstructions and/or people.
- Ensure that the working area is well illuminated.
- Pre-sweep the area to be cleaned.
- Only use brushes or pads provided with the appliance or those specified in the instruction manual.

Do not:

- Use scrubber for picking up hazardous dust.
- Use on surfaces having a gradient exceeding that marked on the machine.
- Allow any inexperienced repairs. Call the experts.
- Strain power cord or try to unplug by pulling on power cord.
- Allow the machine to be used by inexperienced or unauthorized operators or without appropriate training.
- Use the machine without the solution tanks properly positioned on the machine.
- Run the machine over power cable during operation.
- Lift or pull the machine by any of the operating triggers Use the main handle.
- Remove the handle from the machine except for service and repair.
