Public Consultation Meeting

Proposed Start / Stop Time Alignment (for September 2018)

- No buses would need to be added for transportation purposes
- The request is to have all Liverpool Family of Schools on a instructional bell time that enables a one run busing system.
- Current students in grades P to 5 would see no change in start/stop time
- Current students in grades 6 to 8, 9 to 12 would see a 35-50 min later start time.

Timeline of Events

- **2012-2013** Initial consultation about changing start/stop times. The change was not possible at the time without adding 5 additional buses. A commitment was made to review the factors annually.
- **2017 Spring Review** Following review of factors the possibility of change was found and consultations with each school staff and SAC took place. Due to policy 265 timelines no recommendations were made to the school Board for consideration.

2017 (November / December)

Changing of Start/End of school day, Liverpool Family of Schools consultation (policy 265).

2017 / 2018 School Board review/discussion/ decision December/January September 2018 New Start/End of school day in effect at all Liverpool Family of Schools.

Transportation Considerations

- Transportation staff have investigated traffic flow around all three schools in regards to any potential to any safety concerns should a change be implemented.
 - Bus drop off and pickup could occur as it presently does.
 - Parent drop off could continue to occur in designated areas.
 - There would be minimal increase in bus traffic at the schools.
 - Information about transportation changes within Liverpool will be provided to the Region of Queens Municipality following any decision.


What are the Facts should a P-12, One Run busing system for the Liverpool Catchment Area be implemented?

Preliminary observations

- * Number of Buses Available 14
- * Number of Students Eligible for Transportation 836*
- * Potential number of students per bus (Based on Eligibility) 60
- Average Number of students using transportation (5 Field Visits) AM 510**
 PM 510**
- * % of eligible students actually using the bus AM 61% PM 61%
- Number of students per bus based on Field visit AM 36 PM 36

*** 5 Field visits have occurred, visits will be ongoing to confirm the number of students actually using the bus

Student Travel Time



Proposed one run system

Potential Efficiencies Gained

- * Later pick up and shorter travel times for students in far reaches of catchment area current earliest pickup is 6:30 am, projected earliest time would be 7:15 am
- Later bell time for high school students –
- * Fuel Efficiency Current Loaded KM Travel/Day VS Future KM Travel/Day
 - * 368.74 km/day = 71,904.46 km or **\$43,142.67** a year (Avg. \$0.60/km)
- * Driver Paid time savings
 - * 536.5hrs/Year (**\$14485.50**)
- * Total Savings/year
 - * Total: \$57,628.17

Route Designs

- * Mirrored Runs What the driver does in the AM they will do the opposite of in the PM
- * Some present bus stops in the two run system will have to be combined. Preference is given to students with special needs and Elementary Students

What we heard last spring during Staff and SAC Consultation

- Start Stop Times Themes
- * Child care arrangements
- * Safety and parking issues
- Older students grades 6-12 will experience the changes
- Before and after school activities affected
- * Convenience opportunity for parents with siblings traveling at same times including daycare arrangements
